Children must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

- Jan. 1**      **First Day Hike, 1pm.** Start the New Year on the right foot as we start our Fitness Hike series. See separate flyer for full schedule of guided hikes. On New Year's Day, meet the Park Naturalist at the Nature Center for a 1 mile guided hike around the Old Woods Trail. Stay for an additional 3 mile hike to Pioneer Village, the Swinging Bridge, Horseshoe Falls and a Rock Gorge, if you choose.
- Feb. 24**      **Winter Hike, 10am-Noon.** Start at the Wellman Meadows Trailhead parking lot for a self-guided hike to Horseshoe Falls and our 103' swinging bridge. Warm up with a nice soup lunch at the Nature Center before going on to Crawdad Falls. Total 3 mile, or 6 mile hike.
- Mar. 31**      **Easter Egg Hunt / Hike, 1pm.** Join us at the Nature Center for a unique Easter Egg Hunt experience. Find hidden eggs with surprises inside. Afterwards, learn about Ohio native birds, nests and eggs. Paint your own to take home.
