

# ODNR 2012 Recreational Trails Program Grants

County	Applicant	Project	Recommend Funding Amount	Proposal
Lorain	North Ridgeville	South Central Park	\$150,000.00	This project will construct 1 mile of 10ft wide multi-use asphalt trail in South Central Park. This park is a highly used recreation center for the City of North Ridgeville consisting of 4 acre ADA accessible fishing lake, state of the art splash pad, tennis courts, basketball courts, volleyball court, and horseshoe pits. An additional 1.2 miles of trail will be constructed from South Central Park and linking trail users to the North Ridgeville Public Library, City Hall, and adjacent Senior Center. The trail will then extend further to North Ridgeville middle School and St. Peter Church/School.
Tuscarawas	Dennison	Panhandle Passage Trail, Phase 1	\$100,000.00	To construct and engineer approx. 1.1 miles of 10ft wide asphalt, multi-use trail, including a pedestrian bridge to cross Stillwater Creek connecting the communities of Dennison and Uhrichsville.
Wood	Bowling Green	Black Swamp Preserve Trails	\$97,032.00	This proposed project will construct visitor walking trails in the existing 65 acre Black Swamp Preserve, which runs adjacent to the Slippery Elm Trail. A total of 3,988 L.F x 8FT wide trails are proposed to be constructed in this new park, which will tie into the existing city bicycle transportation routes and the 13 mile Slippery Elm Trail.
Franklin	Worthington	Wilson Bridge Multi-Use Trail	\$150,000.00	The City of Worthington is proposing to construct and engineer 1.10 mile x 8ft wide multi-use trail. The purposed project will extend the City of Columbus's Olentangy River Bike Trail and connect into \$270 million improvement project, which will enhance the I-270 U.S. 23 interchange. This improvement project will create the next extension of this projects trail by constructing a pathway on US 23 crossing I270.
Delaware	Delaware	Houk Road Trail	\$150,000.00	This project proposes the development of 1,800 linear feet by 8ft wide asphalt trail, which will serve as the final trail segment needed to complete the entire trail system on the west side of the City of Delaware. The West side section of trails links over 11,000 residents to existing shopping, recreational, and community facilities.
Stark	Plain Township Trustees	Schneider Park Restroom Facility	\$93,525.00	This project will construct an ADA accessible restroom facility in Schneider Community Park. This park serves as a major trailhead facility for Plain Center Trail, which is part of the regional Hoover Connector Trail System linking three parks in the Canton City Parks (Schreiber Park, Reifsnyder Park, Martindale Park, and Oak Park) system and connecting to the Ohio to Erie Canal Historical Corridor. Project is only partially funded due to the expected use of the facility from on trail users.

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Delaware	Orange Township Parks	Graphics Way Trail, Phase 3	\$150,000.00	This proposed project will construct 2,168 linear feet x 10ft wide asphalt trail, which will lead to a pedestrian bridge that will be constructed in 2013 crossing over US 23 in south of Home Rd. This phase of the Graphics Way Trail project will link directly into the existing Lewis Center north and south trails. Phase II of this project will be funded out of the 2012 Clean Ohio Trail Fund grant program.
Erie	Perkins Township	Strickfaden Park Trail	\$150,000.00	This proposed project consists of the construction of a series of trails within an existing 28.4 acres park named Strickfaden Park. The total trail development consists of 6,400 linear feet of 10ft wide asphalt trail.
Lorain	Sheffield Lake	Brookside Nature Trail	\$65,271.00	This proposed project will construct 2,900 LF of 10ft wide asphalt bike trail connecting to the existing Brookside Trail, Scenic Bike By-Way Trail, and the Lorain County Metro Parks Trail.
Clermont	Pierce Township	Pierce Township Hike and Bike Trail	\$126,331.00	The Township seeks to extend the existing Legendary Run Hike/Bike Path and the Township Park walking trail. The project will consist of the construction of 3,700 LF of 8FT wide asphalt trail to inter-connect a local elementary school, an existing public park, police and fire facilities and a 550+ housing unit neighborhood.
Pike, Perry, Jackson, Fulton	ODNR, Division of Forestry	State Forest APV Areas	\$100,000.00	This grant proposal is for trail maintenance that includes, grading, trail improvement, sign repair, and trailhead maintenance/improvement at Pike, Perry, Richland Furnace, and Maumee State Forest APV Areas.
Hocking & Perry	USDA Forest Service, Wayne National Forest	2012 Monday Creek OHV Trail Enhancement	\$200,000.00	Grant proposal seeks funding for light to heavy tread maintenance of approximately 53 miles of trail in the Monday Creek OHV Trail System. This proposal would also cover the cost of one SST (sweet smelling toilet) to be placed at Dorr Run Trailhead.
Various	USDA Forest Service, Wayne National Forest	Educational Grant	\$7,600.00	RTP funds will be used to purchase educational supplies (i.e. brochures that contain safety and responsible land use messages) that would be given to trail riders through our Trail Permit and Trail Patrol Programs.
Lawrence	USDA Forest Service, Wayne National Forest	Pine Grove Connector	\$150,000.00	Supplementary request for an additional \$150,000.00 in motorized RTP funding for the completion of the Pine Grove Connector project RT10(204). This project will construct 9 miles of new trail, main. And grooming of 12 miles of trail, and the development of a new trail-head.
