

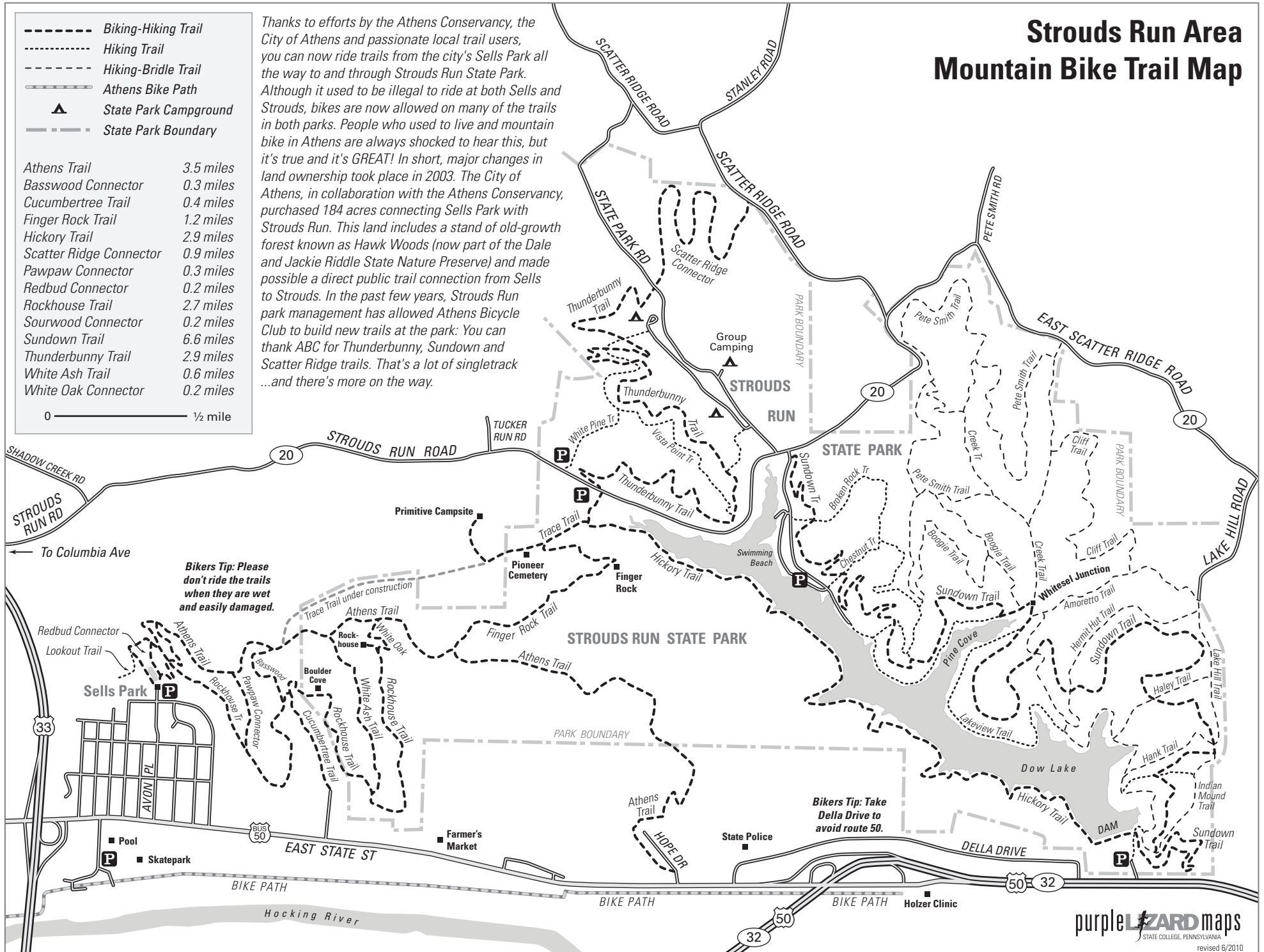
Strouds Run Area Mountain Bike Trail Map

Thanks to efforts by the Athens Conservancy, the City of Athens and passionate local trail users, you can now ride trails from the city's Sells Park all the way to and through Strouds Run State Park. Although it used to be illegal to ride at both Sells and Strouds, bikes are now allowed on many of the trails in both parks. People who used to live and mountain bike in Athens are always shocked to hear this, but it's true and it's GREAT! In short, major changes in land ownership took place in 2003. The City of Athens, in collaboration with the Athens Conservancy, purchased 184 acres connecting Sells Park with Strouds Run. This land includes a stand of old-growth forest known as Hawk Woods (now part of the Dale and Jackie Riddle State Nature Preserve) and made possible a direct public trail connection from Sells to Strouds. In the past few years, Strouds Run park management has allowed Athens Bicycle Club to build new trails at the park: You can thank ABC for Thunderbunny, Sundown and Scatter Ridge trails. That's a lot of singletrack ...and there's more on the way.



Bikers Tip: Please don't ride the trails when they are wet and easily damaged.

Bikers Tip: Take Della Drive to avoid route 50.
